RBWM are currently reviewing the speed limits around our village after sustained pressure from the PC over the last 4 years. The next step is for them to prepare and publish a traffic regulation order and consult on the changes – hopefully gaining police support which has proved key for schemes in other areas.

Recently there was a near miss between a motorist and a schoolchild near The Pound. Motorists please take extra care around the times when school buses are due at The Pound. A safe speed is the speed that will allow you to stop well within the distance you can see to be clear – Highway code rule 126.

Parking around the School

School Parking is causing some concerns again. Particularly around the corner and bend of Brook Lane. Parked cars increase the danger to other road users and are blocking access for emergency vehicles.
